SOME OF MUSKEGON'S VERY EARLY SETTLERS

Donated by Tressa LaFayette

In 1834 Lewis B. Baddeau established a trading post and became a permanent settler of Muskegon. He was of French descent and was born at Three Rivers, near Montreal, Canada.

The second settler on Muskegon Lake was Joseph Troutier, who erected a building in 1835 which he occupied as a trading post for several years. He was born at Mackinac August 9, 1812 where he resided until his settlement in Muskegon.

Wm. Lasley was of French origin, was born in Pennsylvania, spent his early life in Mackinac, and settled in Muskegon in the autumn of 1835, having built a trading post near where is now the corner of Western Avenue and Seventh Street.

Martin Ryerson was born on a farm near Patterson, New Jersey, January 6, 1818. In May, 1836, he came to Muskegon and engaged in the Indian trade with Joseph Troutier. Ryerson moved to Chicago in 1851.

Theodore Newell was a native of Connecticut and settled in Muskegon in 1836. He lived here a few years, moved to Chicago, then to Kenosha, Wis. and back to Chicago where he died in 1869.

Henry Penoyer settled in 1836 at the mouth of Muskegon Lake. He and his brother Augustus built a mill a few miles north of Newaygo. Mr. Penoyer then moved to Grand Haven and then to Nunica.
