
### October 18

### **President Corner**


Hello,



### Apple Goody

Contributed by Alma Decker, she was the fourth of seven children born to German immigrants Hans Jesperson and Louise Wothe on 8 August 1897 in Wisconsin. She moved to Michigan sometime between 1900 and 1910 and by 1920, at the age of 22, she was a maid in the Clark and Clara Mixer household. On the 23rd of October 1921 she married Mr. Isaac W. Decker, a WWI vet and a window cleaner. From what I can gather from the next three census records, no children were born into the marriage. In May 1970, her husband of 48 years passed away at 75 years old. Ms. Alma Decker passed away 28th of January 1973, both are eternally at rest in Lakeside Cemetery.

Part I. 2 c sliced apples 1 t cinnamon ½ c sugar ½ t nutmeg

Spread apples in bottom of greased 12x8 inch dish and sprinkle with the sugar, cinnamon and nutmeg.

Part II. 1/2c oatmeal
½ c brown sugar
½ c flour
1/8 t salt
1/8 t baking powder
1/8 t baking soda
¼ c butter, melted

Mix above ingrediants together, then add melted butter and combine with a fork. Sprinkle over Part I. Bake ½ hour in 350\* oven.

Ancestry DNA has announced a MAJOR update coming this month. Have you checked your DNA through Ancestry lately? If you haven't, you should make it a point to print your DNA results at least once a year (PRIOR to October) just so you can see how your regions and journeys have changed. Ancestry DNA is constantly adding new regions and more journeys to the database, and they currently have 107 overlapping regions which you can read all about here . This will give you some idea of where in the world the DNA Ancestry collects is located and you can see if your genealogical DNA is even available yet!

Remember when looking into the regions, with the number of people testing in that region, will help determine whether there is greater probability of your relationship to that region.


